

A message from our Chairman...

A lot has happened since our last newsletter. We have gained a new council member, Alison Brown. Alison used to be the head of the

physiotherapy department here at Blandford Hospital and following her retirement, agreed to join us. Mike Woods who was already on our council, has now joined us on the Board and agreed he will lead on the recruitment of new members.

On 6th July we held our AGM in the Garden Room in the hospital and this was reasonably well supported with about 30 people attending. Our speaker was Teresa Cole, Locality Manager for North Dorset. She was extremely appreciative of the Friends' work and reflected on some of the projects that the Friends have helped fund. She also gave us an overview of the proposed implications of the clinical services review, where Blandford could become a 'Hub' (a clinical facility with inpatient beds, outpatient clinics and a base for multi-organisational collaborative working). In my view this reflects what we have included in our vision document. This document has been reviewed by our "Action Group" which includes Blandford Hospital Matron, Theatre Sister and local GPs and our own Management Board Members. The reviewed version will soon be available on our web site, shared with the local GPs and the Health Commissioner, to help influence future health care. The review highlighted that 95% of services that were threatened to be withdrawn from the hospital were retained, and new services were added, a great achievement.

I attended a presentation with the Health Commissioners who were looking to reform the way that Community Services are delivered. Their proposal implied that Blandford Hospital would become a Hub and retains its current services with the possibility of adding more services and with a promise of working to keep care as close to home as possible. This is an example of how the members of the Friends can influence local health care and the larger our membership numbers then hopefully the more influential we become.

On a sad note, Mike Wood has informed me that he and his wife will be moving out of the area in the next few months. This will mean Mike resigning from our council and board. Mike will of course be joined by his wife Eve, resigning from her post as a ward volunteer which she has enjoyed for many years. Mike has been a key figure in our organisation for many years; firstly as a car and minibus driving volunteer and, more recently, although still a regular driver, he has actively been involved in our charity shops and as Chairman of our Fundraising Working Group. Both Mike and Eve will be greatly missed and we wish them well with their move.

As always, I thank you for your continued support of the charity and I look forward to updating you again in the Spring newsletter.

Matron's Update...

On Tarrant Ward we are in the process of reviewing our staffing levels and skill mix following our

last patient dependency monitoring exercise.

This highlighted that patients admitted to the hospital these days are much more complex; often with multiple conditions compared to the patients we used to care for on the ward. Many of those patients now are cared for and rehabilitated at home by the community nurses, the integrated community rehab or enablement teams.

This has resulted in us attempting to increase the number of registered nurses (RN's) working on the ward each day from 1 RN looking after 12 patients, changing to 1 RN looking after 8 patients in the future. The aim of this is to enhance safety and to further enhance the quality of care we can provide to our patients. We are in the process of recruiting 3 new RN's to enable us to make this change.

The televisions that the Friends have kindly funded (1 by each patient's bed on Tarrant ward, which are free for patients to use) are in the process of being fitted, this will be great especially for those patients who aren't able to go to the day room.

We are having plans drawn up to provide 2 palliative care suites on Tarrant ward utilising some of the space from the Betty Highwood unit. We hope that there will also be a facility to enable relatives to be more comfortable too.

Our refurbished X-ray department was officially opened in April. The refurbishment was funded by the trust and cost in excess of £220,000. The department not only looks much nicer but also has the most up to date equipment and provides more flexibility to potentially offer increased services in the future.

We have just had the flooring replaced throughout the ground floor corridor. The Physio Gym floor has been replaced and the department has also been redecorated. The Friends have kindly funded the replacement of the dining room flooring. All of the above have helped to make many areas of the hospital to look much nicer and will support our great housekeeping team to keep the hospital clean.

In the Out Patients Department we have moved to digital dictation (a device that links to a computer system). This improves information governance and supports effective communication from the hospital to GP's.

We are still in the process of planning some joint working within the Minor Injuries Unit (MIU) with the Whitecliff GP surgery for their patients.

Proposed Changes to NHS Services

You may have seen news recently regarding some proposed changes to NHS services in Dorset.

The Dorset Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) has, during the last 18-months, engaged in an extensive review of Clinical Services provided in Dorset including the Community Hospitals, many clinicians and managers from the Trust have taken part in that process. On the 13th July the Dorset CCG published its proposals for the future of Integrated Community Services in Dorset. These proposals were to be considered by the Governing Body of Dorset CCG on 20 July 2016.

The Governing Body is likely to agree that the proposals in the document are approved as the basis of a full public consultation. The consultation will take place over a 3-month period starting in the autumn.

There are specific proposals about which of the existing community hospitals should, in the future, have beds / wards. In the proposal, Blandford Hospital is identified as one of the hospitals to retain our inpatient beds / ward. The proposal also identifies which of the hospitals / sites are the most likely to provide care from integrated locality hubs.

It is important to stress that at this point nothing has been decided. The proposals in the document are for consultation. I would also encourage members of the Friends and Public to consider their contributions to the consultation process and share feedback when the public consultation process is underway to support our hospitals services. Responses to the consultation will ultimately shape the community health services in Dorset for the future.

Project Manager's Report...

Our current projects are moving forward and we intend to keep you informed in every newsletter.

First of all, the Hydrotherapy Pool. The Trust were informed that the Friends were prepared to finance the work necessary to get our hydrotherapy pool back in use again and the Trust's response was to obtain quotations for a completely new facility at considerable cost.Our reaction was to enquire why the existing pool could not be repaired with a new up to date plant room installation. After initial resistance we obtained approval to explore this option at our Board Meeting in March from Sally O'Donnell.

Since then both the Trust and the Friends have each been involved in researching the possibilities and obtaining quotations. We will soon be in a position to agree to proceed with the appointment of a company to undertake the work.

The second project currently being worked on is the alteration and refurbishment of our Day Theatre.

Last year the Friends agreed to finance the appointment of a design team to meet with Darren Wickwar [Matron] and Kate Pope [Theatre Sister], Paul Williams [Head of Capital Planning - DHUFT] and ourselves to hear of our collective aspirations for the Day Theatre and to carry out a survey of the existing theatre.

Two new layouts were prepared and presented for comments to Darren and Kate after which a proposed layout was selected which met their requirements. The new theatre will be 64% larger in floor area and this has been achieved within the existing Day Surgery Department.

Next came the appointment of Mechanical and Electrical Engineers as this will be where most of the project costs will be.Quantity Surveyors joined the expanding design team to prepare the contract budget cost, taking into account that the contractors will not be on site till 2017. Currently the plans are being checked for Health & Safety and Infection Control after which the contract budget cost can be finalised and the project can be presented to the Trustees of the Friends and the Management Board.

With Trustee approval, discussions can commence with the Trust to move the project to the next stage – Out to tender with a start date on site of early 2017, hopefully. Finally, we are involved with Darren and Gill Wood [Tarrant Ward Sister] in progressing the preliminary design of two new palliative care suites along with an overnight suite for next of kin/family. This is a very exciting proposal which Gill has been pushing for ever since they closed Portman Ward and the two adjoining Family Rooms.

The area to be used is adjacent and accessed from within the Tarrant Ward and will use the Day Room, internal courtyard, conservatory and adjoining rooms which were originally part of Betty Highwood Unit which closed several years ago.

This project is being financed by the Trust, however the Friends will be providing the finance for the "icing on the cake" with the finishing touches.

We hope, by the next newsletter in March, I will be able to report that all projects will have progressed significantly towards reality.

Keep your fingers crossed because we all know that the NHS agenda continually changes!
