Our support continues both at the hospital and throughout the community...

During the last year the Management Board has been pleased to authorise support for a diverse range of projects in the hospital, with community related health projects and within our own Community Services Scheme.

Grants have been made to the Blandford Opportunity Group, Blandford Youth Trust and Life Education Wessex. Sturminster Newton Leisure Centre have received funding for 2 new treadmills to use within their GP exercise referral scheme and funding was also approved for defibrillator training for staff and volunteers at the centre.

Within the hospital itself the following projects have received our support:

- Numerous applications have been authorised under the "Geoffrey Swain" award scheme to provide additional staff training, over and above that provided by the NHS, to enhance the services provided to patients.
- A new cover and steps were provided for the Hydrotherapy pool.
- Therapeutic singing and drumming is funded within the Betty Highwood Unit.
- A wall clock was purchased for Tarrant Ward.
- Funding for books, posters, pictures and music was authorised for the Betty Highwood Unit.
- Funding has been approved for 16 new bedside patient's lockers for Tarrant Ward and also for over-bed tables for the ward.

Of course, a huge amount of our funding is used to fund our ever expanding volunteer transport service and to run our minibus which is widely used to support those that are socially isolated or have limited mobility. The transport scheme and minibus have so far, during the financial year since April 2012, been funded to the cost of over £33,000. However, it should be stressed that donations have been received in excess of £8,000 from users of these services.

Later in the newsletter you will be able to read just how funding applications are considered and approved.

Do you have storage space to spare?

We are looking for additional storage space in the Blandford and Sturminster Newton area to support our charity shops and series of events throughout the year.

Maximising monies raised is always a priority as with any charity and therefore we like to keep our costs as low as possible. Storage is sought for clothing, items for the Autumn Fair and also a store/working space for the Annual Auction. This could be in one location or perhaps as smaller units.

Do you possibly have a dry, secure unit that you would be able to offer for this purpose? Perhaps you have a garage you do not use? Are you a property owner with outbuildings currently not needed? Perhaps you are a local business with empty premises that could be put to good use? If so, please think about the possibility of helping out our local charity. Since our last newsletter went out in September the fundraising team have been busy with their schedule to finish the 2012 calendar and now have an exciting year of events ahead.

We have already run 4 bingos during this financial year and have one more to come, the Easter Bingo on 21st March. So far, we have made a surplus of £1182 throughout the year so hope to beat last year's figure of £1652.

As a new venture for us, the Race Night at Bryanston Estate Club in October, organised by Mike Wood, proved to be a great financial success and a most entertaining evening. Our thanks must go to all of our sponsors who supported the evening and, of course, to Bryanston Club for allowing us to use their fantastic premises. A net surplus of £871 was recorded for this event.

Autumn Fair

The Autumn Fair is always a great event. To gather such a fantastic range of quality goods, to transform the Corn Exchange and to receive so much support from a huge team of volunteers and supporters is always heart warming. We are always pleased to hear that a queue is forming outside waiting for the start of the fair and those bargain hunters always go away happy. With over 60 volunteers on duty over 2 days it is a logistical triumph and every one of those volunteers deserve a huge thanks. Net profit this year for the Autumn Fair (including the raffle) was £5872.

Future Plans

As we prepare this newsletter, we are trying to reintroduce a concert by the Band of The Royal Corps of Signals to our schedule for this year or 2014. We are also looking forward to our Fashion Show in Spring 2014, Linda and her team will be starting work on that soon, so we will fill you in with details in our Autumn newsletter. Finally, the Fundraising Team have started to put plans together for a Charity Golf day together with an Auction of Promises during the early summer months of 2014.

Chairman's Message

As a result of suggestions by the Action Group of the Friends, a meeting was set up in December of last year between all the relevant parties needed to make decisions about new services at Blandford Hospital to be provided by Poole and Bournemouth General Hospital. The meeting was very positive and it explored the most viable and needed services that could be provided. It was thought that, initially, they would limit it to three areas, namely, ophthalmology and ambulatory care such as chemotherapy and blood transfusion. The last given could initially be given in the new Sun Room in the Portman Ward. The Hydro therapy pool would be a great asset in providing pain relief. It is hoped that these services will be set up without delay.

Another new service that is soon to be established is maxo-facial surgery – dealing with facial lumps and bumps.

There are, therefore, good reasons to be optimistic about the future of our hospital. The Friends will, of course, be involved in representing the views and needs of the public, but also in financing a range of new equipment such as up to date ultra sound and the setting up of a high tech treatment room. This will run in parallel with the present theatre, though it might eventually replace it, as it is likely that procedures, in the future, will be limited to those only needing local anaesthetic.

With the prospect of being involved in considerable expenditure it is very encouraging that the two shops recorded almost a 3% increase in their takings in the 2012 calendar year to over £117,000 – a great achievement. I thank all those involved in our shops and fundraising events generally, they certainly do a great job.

It is pleasing that our community volunteers continue to expand. There is an ever increasing demand for transport. Our minibus is used daily and we hope to have a bigger vehicle in July. Our volunteers working in the hospital are also much appreciated for the help given and the difference they make on the wards. I have witnessed their smiling presence at first hand. We are also developing our befriending service which is very pleasing.

I am proud to chair such a vibrant and valuable organisation and I thank all those who contribute in so many ways to its success.

Matron's Update – February 2013



There has been a reorganisation within our directorate and community hospitals and community services (community nursing and therapy

teams) have now been placed in locality groups. Blandford Community Hospital is in the North Dorset and Purbeck locality which is led by Sally O'Donnell (Deputy Director Community Services). The locality manager (manager of community nursing and therapy teams) is Teresa Cole and she is based within the hospital.

I am pleased to say that we are encouraging direct admissions to Tarrant ward from local GP's, community nurses and therapy teams to prevent admissions to the acute hospitals for those people that can't be cared for safely at home. We are in the process of recruiting 2 new staff nurses on Tarrant ward and also eagerly await the arrival of a new health care assistant to join the team. We have recruited 2 more dementia champions on the ward to offer support and advice to patients, relatives and members of staff.

Some new services that are to be commenced within the day surgery unit include minor orthopaedic surgery (start date TBC) and maxillary facial surgery which will commence in February. Discussions are still ongoing regarding the development of community dental sessions.

In December there was a meeting with Dorset HealthCare (our trust), the Friends Action group and the senior team at Poole and Bournemouth

hospitals regarding some services that they may be able to support within the hospital. Work is ongoing to encourage such developments, some of which may be provided within the Portman ward area, which would be wonderful.

We have recruited a new nurse to the Minor Injury unit team following the retirement of one of our nurses after 33 years loyal service. The new nurse has vast experience, working within urgent care settings as a nurse and emergency care practitioner, and I'm sure will be an asset to our team.

We will be commencing a new orthopaedic outpatient clinic in the near future within the outpatients department and there is a Dorset-wide review of Leg ulcer care which may lead to some changes with the leg ulcer clinic which is provided within the outpatients department, this clinic is currently working to full capacity.

The Betty Highwood unit are in the process of recruiting 2 new health care assistants to compliment the team and are working to improve the environment by redecorating some areas and purchasing some new furniture and curtains. The Friends have kindly agreed to fund the purchase of some new artwork.

We have recently received much positive feedback from patients that have been cared for within the hospital which is very motivating to the team.

May I take this opportunity to wish everyone a happy and healthy 2013.

not hesitate to call for a chat. In addition to the transport there are various other voluntary opportunities available.

We have just held our annual "Post Christmas" meal by way of showing our appreciation to our team of volunteers - a good night was had by all!

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How does the Friends of Blandford Hospital Work?

Part Four: The Finance and Projects Committee

In the previous three editions of our newsletters we have talked about our history, the structure of the charity and how we generate our income. Now comes the final instalment, how we decide to spend that income. The consideration of funding requests is undertaken by our Finance and Projects Committee (F&P).

The F&P Committee membership consists of the President, Chairman, Deputy Chairman, Project Manager, Secretary, Chair for the Community Services Group, and other Council members of the charity. I chair the committee. We also have in attendance, when possible, the Hospital Matron and a Community Matron - with an open invitation to the GPs. We meet quarterly at the hospital and report to the Friends Management Board.

The role of the F&P Committee is to consider health related requests for financial help. These requests are reviewed, discussed and debated by the group. All requests are researched thoroughly prior to the meeting to confirm the request is health related, conforms with our constitution and is not something that should be funded directly by the NHS. If funding is considered appropriate, in line with our criteria, the request is then forwarded to the board with a recommendation to approve. The group also monitors and receives reports on projects and will make recommendation if necessary.

As you will have read on the front page of the newsletter, the funding we authorise is wide ranging and all requests are considered on their own merit.
