Blandford Hospital receives national accreditation for end of life care

'Seamless and sensitive care' and strong leadership have earned national accreditation for the Tarrant Ward here at the Hospital.

The ward, which provides end of life care, has been recognised by the prestigious Gold Standards Framework, which is a national health programme for reviewing and delivering end of life care.

In particular, the strong leadership of the hospital was recognised, as well as the high level of engagement shown by all members of staff and the way they worked together well as a team, ensuring that every patient receives efficient and appropriate care.

Darren Wickwar, Matron, said: "This is a fantastic achievement for the hospital but, first and foremost, recognition must go to our fantastic staff. The entire team is hugely passionate about the work they do and this is apparent in the high level of care they provide to our patients.

"End of life care can at times be very sensitive and emotional, it's about making the patient as comfortable and supported as possible and, at the hospital, we are always looking for ways to make this time more peaceful.

"The accreditation is a brilliant way to recognise the hard work of our team and we will continue to develop and improve the care we already provide to the community."

Caroline Abrahams, Charity Director for Age UK, added: "Better end of life care for individuals depends on good communication and the willingness and ability of health and social care professionals to take a person-centred approach. It should be the cornerstone of professional education and workforce development in health and care services".

"The Gold Standards Framework plays a crucial role through its training and accreditation programme in enabling front line



health and care staff to initiate difficult conversations regarding the development of a person's end of life care plan, and ultimately deliver care that meets their needs and wishes."

Professor John Young, NHS England National Clinical Director for Integration and Frail & Elderly Care, commented: "It is a great pleasure to be presenting the GSF Quality Hallmark accreditation awards. I applaud the winners of these awards as they lead the way in providing skilful and compassionate end of life care based on a foundation of individual plans agreed between patient and those caring for them. We can all learn from their work."

A message from our Chairman...

Well now that the Festive Season is over, I can report that I have enjoyed some wonderful Christmas dinners with the volunteers and have met some interesting people. Tish and her

team pulled out all the stops and served us a fantastic Christmas dinner on each occasion which was enjoyed by all. I was amazed that we now have 61 volunteers involved with the Blandford Shop and 47 with Sturminster Newton Shop. There are another 48 involved with our Community Services that we provide through the office. Over 150 volunteers helping to enhance the patient care locally, something we should be proud of.

My main focus this year is to increase our membership, exploring ways of maintaining and increasing the number of people that are members of the Friends. As at the end of July 2015 we had 750 members compared to 1400 when our membership peaked several years ago. Consequently, we would like to recruit more members. We have been trying to increase our membership through our shops, events and our community services and I know this is having some good effect. To help this along I am in the process of setting up a small group of Trustees to focus on membership retention and expansion. You may ask why we need to increase our membership. The more members we have the bigger the influence we have on the local health services and the clinical commissioning group. Membership fees can be a minimum of £1 per year, but members are free to choose what they donate. Application forms are available from both of our shops, our website and the office.

There has been some very positive news for the hospital recently. Congratulations firstly go to Matron and Tarrant Ward on winning a National Award for Excellence for End of Life Care, following their completion of the Gold Standard's Framework. In achieving this award the ward has demonstrated top quality care for all people nearing end of life. Well done!



Secondly, I was asked to attend the Dorset Foundation Trust's Annual Heroes Award, and to present the winner in the Leadership Award. There were three people short listed and I was delighted to present the award with Simon Weston the Falklands Veteran to Matron Darren for his outstanding leadership skills. Excellent!

Our efforts this year are focusing on reopening the Hydrotherapy pool so local people won't need to travel to Dorchester or Salisbury, upgrading the Operating Theatre which has become rather tired and outdated. We are also exploring the possibility of developing overnight accommodation for relatives of patients on Tarrant Ward. Another project we are involved with is looking at ways of increasing car parking as we all know the problems it's causing at the moment.

My final thought in this message is that if every member found one new member we would double our membership overnight, what a challenge!

RECENT SUPPORT FOR OUR HOSPITAL

After an exceptional period of financial support to our hospital with the redevelopment of the old Portman Ward into the now busy Portman Unit, we continue this year to help our hospital and the community. As our motto says - *"We make a difference"*.

In the hospital we have provided £26,000 to enable the hospital to continue with the use of a vehicle for the Occupational Therapy Department who are now located within the Portman Unit. The van is essential to the "day to day" working of the department.

In June we renewed our financial support to enable two very much appreciated groups to continue, "Music & Singing in Tarrant Ward" and "Drumming & Singing in Tarrant Ward". Matron and staff say that these activities are enjoyed by the patients and certainly improve their stay in hospital. The costs are £80 per month and £150 per month respectively.

Matron approached us to see if we would provide a device which when connected to the TV in the day room supports activities for the patients. The tablet type device complements the present activities in the ward with varying activities such as bingo, play your cards right, enabling photos etc and a 3 minute video to be loaded to stimulate the brain and relieve boredom. We approved the cost of £5000.

August saw a request to help with a patient entertainment system which would provide a TV to each patient by their bed in Tarrant Ward. This was supported by Matron and the Ward Sister. We felt that this was certainly a way in which the Friends could - "We make a difference". We approved the cost £22,000.

Electronics continue to offer benefits that could enhance a patients experience in hospital and we received a request to provide a My Dementia Improvement Network (MDIN) System which supports meaningful activity sessions in the ward. Once again we approved the cost \pm 7245.

A request was received from Tish who runs our wonderful kitchen and in-house services to ask if we would pay for some new flooring within the dining room which was not in this year's NHS budget. We considered this important as it reflects publicly our hospital image and we agreed to assist and approved the cost of £2068

Within the hospital we continue to provide many ongoing daily services. Daily newspapers at a cost of approx £200 per month, approved staff training and gardening, looking after the Millennium Garden and the internal courtyard in the Portman Unit.

During the year we also receive many requests for financial support from groups and organisations within the community. Within our constitution we are required to consider such requests providing they are from "not for profit", health related groups. All requests are scrutinised in detail which involves meeting the group in their place of operation, examining their annual accounts, establishing the health related work that they undertake and the support they provide within the community.

This year has seen Life Education Wessex receive a donation of \pounds 6200 towards their annual running costs to continue their very valuable work with children, touring the area, visiting schools and teaching the children the "safe facts of life".

In June we also donated £7500 to Blandford Youth Trust an organisation that we have supported for many years. The Trust pays the wages of Ken Reynolds who acts as a councillor at The Blandford School for the pupils. This is a very valuable service helping children at times of difficulty.

At the end of last year we received a request for financial support from a small local group linked to the Milldown Unit called "The Willow Tree Group" who meet in the bungalow behind Castleman House. They provide a weekly hot meal for members of the community who, due to their mental health would not leave their home to socialise and struggle with their pennies each week. This is the second year we have given a donation towards their running costs for 2016 and given them £3000. The Willow Tree Group

also continues with their own modest fundraising, having a stall and raffle in the hospital reception twice a year by kind permission of Matron.

Just before the end of the year we were able to support another group assisting with mental health within the community. "Be Positive" provides vital support and facilities to members of the community that are suffering from mental health issues and Dr Kit Stone of the Milldown Unit says that this facility is invaluable. This group was supported by Dorset County Council until a couple of years ago when the annual grant was taken away suddenly in government "cut backs". This forced the group to vacate their small rented shop with meeting room in Tabernacle Walk. That was when they first approached the Friends for help last year, which we did donating £5000 for 2015 to assist to "kick start" their group again. This enabled them to secure a lease on a small shop with meeting room facilities on the first floor in Anchor Gateway off Salisbury Street.

This year we have donated \pounds 6000 towards their running costs for 2016 and they also continue with their own fund raising through their shop and fund raising events.



The picture (kindly provided by Nicci Brown of Forum Focus) was taken at the handing over of our cheque to Florence Spencer Group Leader of "Be positive" at the official opening of their charity shop. They also have a first floor meeting room with internet and kitchen facilities available for their service users.

We must also remember that on a daily basis we provide an extremely valuable community transport scheme to people in need throughout our rural community. This would not operate without our great team of volunteer



drivers, their cars and our own two wheelchair adapted minibuses.

None of this support would be possible without the ongoing support of our membership and I very much look forward to being able to update you on these and other projects later in the year.

Matron's Update...

As reported Tarrant Ward has become the first Community Hospital in Dorset to be accredited with the Gold Standards Framework (GSF)

Quality Hallmark award, this is mainly regarding advanced care planning and end of life care. The GSF feedback report described the team as trailblazers. The team had to provide evidence of their care to a panel of 4 during an inspection on the ward, team members were interviewed and a portfolio presented for review. This is a great achievement and as the Hospital Matron I am really proud of the team and the high standard of care they deliver to our patients. One of the ward Sisters and 2 Health Care Assistants attended a presentation in London to receive the award.

I am happy to share that we have recently had success in recruiting into all of our vacant posts within the hospital including domestic, porters, healthcare assistants and our registered nurse vacancies. Most vacancies were due to retirement/promotion. It has been a real challenge to us over recent months to recruit registered nurses. This is not only common in community hospitals in Dorset but nationwide.

The Friends have kindly funded an electronic device supporting the great work our activities co-ordinator undertakes, this is useful to many patients on Tarrant Ward. The system is very effective in calming agitation and distress in patients. It has numerous features including reminiscence and activities which can be accessed via touchscreen technology including music, photographs, famous speeches, poetry, radio shows, archive TV shows including Dads Army, Fawlty Towers and lots more. There is also bingo, karaoke, exercise sessions and quizzes within the activities section and it also enables Skype visiting.

We are currently seeing evidence of the following:

- Reduction in falls
- Positive indictors towards nutrition
- Meaningful Activities
- Reducing Length of Stay in Hospital

The Friends have also agreed to fund individual televisions on Tarrant ward which will greatly enhance the patients experience especially for those who aren't able to use the day room.

We are still in discussions and planning a pilot with Whitecliff Surgery with some joint working in our Minor Injuries Unit.

Our X-ray department is currently being refurbished at a cost of approximately £220,000, this will provide up to date equipment and environment. Unfortunately this has caused the department to close temporarily until the end of March.

Car parking remains a challenge to us and we are exploring ways to hopefully improve this with our estates team.

Dorset HealthCare Heroes Staff Recognition Scheme

We want to celebrate the brilliant achievements of our staff and we want you to help us!

The Staff were asked how we should recognize our unsung heroes within the Trust, those people who we see working day in, day out, beyond the call of duty for our patients. Overwhelmingly, they said, "we just want to be thanked".

So the trust has launched Dorset Healthcare Heroes, a monthly and annual awards scheme to recognise the many brilliant people working across the Trust.

Anyone can nominate a member of staff, volunteer, bank worker or a team for that extra special thank you. Nominations are open all year, because we know that we have amazing people doing amazing things 365 days a year, around the clock.

Every month the Trust will recognize our heroes going "above and beyond" and once a year there will be an awards ceremony. There are 7 categories to choose from, the Trust values:

Community Services and Volunteering with the Friends... *Help us make a difference!*

We have been fortunate with the weather this winter so to date we have been able to continue with all planned social and shopping trips.

Like we always aim to do, we managed to arrange and fulfil all of our pre-Christmas excursions without a hitch or hindrance from the weather, all of which were thoroughly enjoyed by all participating. These ranged from Christmas shopping trips to get those vital presents, Christmas lunches, and not forgetting the pantomime.

We continue to be as busy as ever, the service continues to grow and the volunteers continue to come up "trumps"!!

This leads onto our post-Christmas volunteers' dinner. This was held in January and is our opportunity to say a huge "thank you" to all our volunteers for everything they have done throughout the year. The service simply couldn't and wouldn't operate so smoothly without their dedication and support. There are various volunteering roles in which you could support us, so if you would like to know more please give the office a call.



We can now start looking forward to the spring and begin planning our social trips.

For those of you who are not fully aware of our service, the procedure is as follows: any person requesting any part of our service will need a referral from their GP. This can be requested from your surgery, if your GP feels it is appropriate and that there is a need for our assistance and you meet the criteria.

Hospital car transport – this should be your last port of call i.e. if you do not drive, or currently unable due to your current position, have no family member or friend available, and public transport is not a viable option. All of our drivers are volunteers so it is not a guaranteed service but we certainly endeavour to fulfil as many requests as we possibly can. We do ask for a voluntary donation to help cover the costs as we reimburse the drivers for their fuel expenses. Social Trips/shopping – again via a GP referral. This service is for those who would normally struggle to get their shopping. There are limited spaces for our shopping service but we currently have some available. As for the social trips, we currently have 100+ clients already on our database. Upon receiving your GP referral you would be placed on our client list. As you can appreciate these trips will be offered fairly and appropriately, but I will certainly endeavour to give everyone the opportunity. Most of the social trips are fairly seasonal.

Just as a reminder:

There is often confusion around being a "Member of the Friends". This is to support The Friends and the work we do within the Hospital and community. To be a member an annual subscription (from as little as \pounds 1) is payable for which we are always grateful. All members will receive newsletters and information about our projects and fund raising events, together with annual accounts. However, this does not automatically entitle you to use our voluntary transport system or attend social/shopping trips on our minibus.
