From the Chairman

As reported in our Spring newsletter, the work of our Action Group of the Friends continues. Discussions with the Trust are still ongoing regarding the future of services available at Blandford Hospital. Whilst we are still very much regretting the shutting of Portman Ward we are now working positively towards using it in a number of ways that will benefit the health of the community. We hope to develop a day treatment centre; a unit for such treatments as chemotherapy; a day centre for the Weldmar Hospice; and it will also enable the day hospital to be moved there to allow office space to be offered to Social Services for the Community Services Team. Meanwhile, I have had personal experience of the excellent treatment offered to my wife by Tarrant Ward. They are a credit to the NHS and demonstrate the value of community hospitals as 'step down' facilities from acute hospitals. They are able to treat

patients as whole people in contrast to acute hospitals, who, of necessity, treat specific conditions. We are all very proud of the hospital and the real care it offers.

Our volunteers have an increasingly vital role to play both in the hospital and community. We have volunteers staffing our charity shops in Blandford and Sturminster Newton. Volunteers also provide transport for medical appointments, drive and escort on our minibus for shopping and social trips, provide support on Tarrant Ward and offer companionship. The Trustees (Council) present their report along with the financial statement of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2013. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and reporting by Charities 2005. The Friends are a registered charity (No. 800482) and whose business is conducted and managed by its Officers and Trustees. This charity is governed by the rules of The Friends of Blandford Community Hospital Constitution, Objects and Rules, dated March 1994 (amended 2008).

Objectives and Activities

The object of the Friends is to relieve patients and former patients of Blandford Community Hospital and other invalids in the community (defined as the area served by the Dorset HealthCare University NHS Foundation Trust) who are sick, convalescent, disabled, handicapped, infirm or in need of financial assistance and, generally, to support the work of the hospital.

In considering applications for financial support the following priorities are adopted:

a. Major projects that add to the well-being and/or treatment of patients and/or the working conditions of the staff.

- b. Additional equipment that would extend or enhance work carried out by consultants in the hospital.
- c. Additional equipment to facilitate treatment given in the wards and outpatient clinics.
- d. Grants for further training of hospital staff, especially nursing staff.
- e. Improvements to the hospital environment.
- f. Equipment for improved care in the community.

It is expected that Dorset HealthCare University NHS Foundation Trust will fund the provision and replacement of standard hospital equipment, and fixtures and fittings.

Plans for Future Periods

While the Friends of Blandford Hospital have no authority to dictate how things should be developed, nevertheless, they are recognised as a responsible representative of both patient and staff opinions and needs. As such, they are being made party to the decision making process, which is very much welcomed. The work of the action group continues, with the Friends still very much involved. While it is no longer easy to donate equipment to the hospital without going through endless stages of scrutiny, the fact that the Friends' finances are healthy means that they are in a strong position to enable things to happen - such as the reconfiguration of the Portman Ward - as and when decisions are made as to the services that can be provided. In the meantime, we continue to operate our voluntary transport service and our dedicated volunteers continue to meet the ever increasing demand for this. The future of the hospital is secure and the Friends have an increasingly important role in shaping that future.

Recent and Future Developments

The following new services have now started: Maxillary Facial, Day Surgery List, Diabetic Eye Screening and an Ophthalmology clinic run by Royal Bournemouth Hospital. Ongoing discussions for potential developments are Collocation of Health & Social Care Teams, Dermatology treatments, Pain Management, Community Dental Service, Ambulatory care, Orthopaedic clinic/ day surgery treatment and varicose veins treatment - day surgery.

Staff and Volunteers


The Council has been well supported as usual by the three members of staff, Sarah Connors as office manager, Lisa Deverell as community services coordinator and Emma Sisson as fundraising coordinator, each, along with the many volunteers, contribute significantly to the efficiency of the Friends' organisation and activities.


Financial Review

In the year ended 31 March 2013 we have seen a reduction in legacies received of £40,000 but the unrealised gain on our investments of £152,887 and the profit from the sale of an asset have meant that we see an increase in our income this year of £221,570. As there is still considerable uncertainty in respect of the future facilities to be provided at Blandford this continues to frustrate the efforts of the Friends to effectively contribute to the Hospital. However we do see an increase in our expenditure on Charitable Activities which includes spending in the Hospital, covering our Mini Bus and Community Volunteers Scheme as well as several contributions to health related projects within the wider Community. Total funds held by the Friends are however increased by £287,039 to £1,906,921.
