#### From the Chairman

The redevelopment of the old Portman Ward is now complete and was officially opened in November 2014 by our patron Lord Portman. We now have a modern new unit (the Portman Unit), consisting of two dental suites, associated offices, a multi-functional clinic with consultation and examination rooms with a small waiting area. Also, an ambulatory care and rehab area, an O.T. treatment and splint suite, a four bed day surgery ward with a step down adjoining lounge, a reception area for the new day clinic and a refurbished MIU.

Our charity performance during the year has continued to go from strength to strength and this is down to the never ending support of our enthusiastic team of volunteers. Our fund raising events have again,

continued to raise much needed income. Our two hospital charity shops in Blandford and Sturminster Newton continue to be well supported and this year have recorded their highest ever revenue. In addition to supporting our hospital and community financially, our equally energetic community volunteers provide assistance on the ward, be-friending those in their own homes and providing drivers for our voluntary transport scheme. Our minibus is busier than ever and with both of our vehicles wheelchair adapted; we are able to continue to provide our minibus shopping trips and social trips. This enables us to help those referred to our service by their GP.

Our achievements and performance for the year are the result of our volunteers' efforts to serve their community and this is driven by the personal fulfilment each and every one gets from helping others and the friendships generated as we all work together.

#### **Recent and Future Developments**

Our fund raising committee have planned another exciting year of events for the coming year and we look forward to the local community supporting us. Unfortunately, we will have to drop our annual auction in the coming year, but are selling our donated items in different ways. Two years ago, a vision document was produced identifying the health needs of the local community and the services that could be delivered, either in the community hospital or in the patient's home. This document needs to be reviewed in partnership with local GPs and the Dorset Healthcare University NHS Foundation Trust. We will be exploring the development of a family room for the relatives of patients on Tarrant Ward for overnight stays and also looking at the upgrading of the hydrotherapy pool and the day theatre. We will continue our role as representative of patient needs whether within the hospital or the community, and we are grateful to the Dorset HealthCare University NHS Foundation Trust for accepting us as a responsible participant in the future of our hospital and community care.

The Trustees present their report along with the financial statement of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2015. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and reporting by Charities 2006. The Friends are a registered charity (No. 800482) and whose business is conducted and managed by its Officers and Trustees. This charity is governed by the rules of The Friends of Blandford Community Hospital Constitution, Objects and Rules, dated March 1994 (amended 2008).

#### **Objectives and Activities**

The objects of the Friends are to relieve patients and former patients of Blandford Community Hospital and other invalids in the community (defined as the area served by the Dorset HealthCare University NHS Foundation Trust) who are sick, convalescent, disabled, handicapped, infirm or in need of financial assistance and, generally, to support the work of the hospital.

In pursuance of these objects the Council continued to raise funds and to invite and receive contributions from individuals and organisations by way of subscriptions, donations or otherwise. Efforts are made to enlist the support of a broadly based substantial membership in order to keep in touch with the actual needs of the population, and existing members are encouraged to assist in this respect. The Friends continued to supplement the service provided by the hospital management for the health, welfare and comfort of patients and other invalids in the community, and also provided amenities in the hospital and community for patients and staff.

In considering applications for financial support the following priorities are adopted:

- a) Major projects that add to the well-being and/or treatment of patients and/or the working conditions of the staff.
- b) Additional equipment that would extend or enhance work carried out by consultants in the hospital.
- c) Additional equipment to facilitate treatment given in the ward and outpatient clinics.
- d) Grants for further training of hospital staff, especially nursing staff.
- e) Improvements to the hospital environment.
- f) Equipment for improved care in the community.

It is expected that Dorset HealthCare University NHS Foundation Trust will fund the provision and replacement of standard hospital equipment, and fixtures and fittings.

#### **Financial Review**

In the year ended 31st March 2015 we have seen a decrease in income from legacies of some £120,000 and although there has been a further unrealised gain on our investments we see an overall decrease in our income for this year of £220,773 compared with last year. Having funded £750,000 last year towards the new Portman Suite our spend on Charitable Activities this year amounts to £92,931 which includes spending in the Hospital and covers our Mini Bus and Community Volunteers Scheme as well as several contributions to health related projects within the Community. We therefore see this year an excess of income of £99,189. Total funds now held by the The Friends still stand at a very healthy £1,582,769.

#### Independent Examiner

The Charities Act 2006 introduced an increased income threshold amending the previous audit requirements. At the Friends' present income level an independent examination can be undertaken instead of an audit and advantage has been taken of this provision. Mr J N Butt A.C.A. who holds the necessary professional accountancy qualification and who has been independent of the Friends activities and decisions during the past year was accordingly appointed in this respect.
