# A message from our Chairman...

How quickly the year passes by! We held our AGM on Wednesday 4 July and it was well attended. I was pleased to see both our new President "Mac" chairing the meeting and Helen Hunt, our new Matron, who introduced herself to the audience. Helen will be working in Blandford on a part time basis until the end of September when she will finish at St Leonard's and move to Blandford Hospital full time. It was also very pleasing to see that we have 3 new Trustees who are from various backgrounds and will add more expertise to our Council. Our membership numbers have increased to over 1000, sounds good but we have counted them differently this year. Joint membership now counts as 2, but it would be nice to increase the numbers even more, as the Friends of Sherborne and Swanage have over 2000 each.

It was nice to see so many of our volunteers at the Volunteers Week celebration at the Crown Hotel, Blandford in June, where they were recognised by the NHS for the great work we do and at our own Volunteers Afternoon Teas here at the hospital.

The NHS Trust put on an engagement day at the Crown Hotel where 180 people from across Dorset attended a session on Pain Management, it was a super day and very successful.

The Trust would like to encourage local people to become members of the NHS Trust, as everyone from the age of 11 is eligible to join. Membership is free and application forms are available at Blandford Hospital or online via the Trust's website. Once a member you are able to vote at election time for the governor you think will do a good job in holding the board to account. As an added benefit there are various NHS discounts you will be eligible to claim such as reduced car parking prices at airports, weekend breaks and discounts at various stores and many more.

We were hoping to have our new website uploaded by now, but unfortunately we are still having problems with the web designer. Let's hope it won't take too much longer.

As you will see explained in out Project Manager's update, the repairs to the Hydrotherapy unit will no longer go ahead following a business case evaluation by the Trust. We are instead helping to upgrade that area to a Musculoskeletal treatment centre. This will support patients with a one stop treatment clinic and will compliment the pain service that already operates from Blandford Hospital.

## **Project Manager's Report...**

At last I have some clarity to report about the Hydrotherapy Pool's

future along with the alteration and refurbishment of our Treatment Suite/Theatre.

On the 17th January I attended a meeting with Trust representatives to get, it was hoped, final agreement to repair the hydrotherapy pool. Unfortunately I was informed that continued hydrotherapy treatment at our hospital was not the way forward for the Trust with provision available in other neighbouring accessible hospitals. However, the Trust wished the area in Physiotherapy to be used to provide a one-stop MSK clinic (musculoskeletal service) which will link up with the Trust service across Dorset.

After three years of pursuing the Trust on this project it was decided to ask for a meeting with Mr Ron Shields, the Chief Executive which was arranged by our Chairman. We met on the 22nd February. The result was the same – the pool area was to become an MSK clinic and after further explanation by the Chief Executive, we discussed at our next Management Board Meeting and have now informed the Trust that the Friends will be happy to assist financially to achieve completion of this MSK clinic project.

And now movement seems to be coming. I have received an invitation to attend a meeting on the 2nd August to discuss the MSK Clinic with the Head of Physiotherapy for the Trust, so keep your fingers crossed that we will have a project to report soon.

I have been asking for a Capital Works Meeting with the Trust since the beginning of the year and at last a date of 18th May was agreed. Trust representatives explained the outcome of the Clinical Service Review regarding our hospital. Blandford Community Hospital is to become a hub for Health Care for Blandford and the surrounding area and our vision document prepared a few years ago has been answered.

Our Treatment Suite/Theatre alteration and the MSK Clinic are in the Trust Capital Works for the coming year so we will be pressing the Trust to proceed on both projects.

Finally, I can report that Estates have completed the enabling works necessary to the ceilings in the Day Room and the corridor by the Nurses Station in Tarrant Ward so that the two Tovertafel can be installed.

Tovertafel is a "Magic Table" which, by use of a ceiling supported computer, projects on the table surface below a series of interactive light games specifically designed for patients with mild - to late -stage dementia.

It was developed over 12 years by Dutch PhD student Hester Le Riche, who wanted to create something to stimulate activity, physical, mental, and social in people with later stage dementia.

The computer/projector also includes infrared sensors and a speaker, which detects hand and arm movement, controls the games and projects light animations onto the table surface.

The audio-visual stimulation gives those living with dementia, who may previously have rarely demonstrated any capability for interaction, to follow the projected images with their hands and eyes, attempting to grasp the shapes. The table can be used by one person or as a group, so encourages interaction with other people.

The installation took place in July and has proved a great success with patients and staff. It has also been enjoyed during visiting times by patients and their families being able to interact with fun activities.

Tarrant Ward has also had visits from Occupational & Physiotherapy in the hospital who propose to use the Tovertafel with some of their patients.

# Community Services and Volunteering with the Friends...

## Help us make a difference

Here we are again almost at the end of what has been the most glorious summer. We have taken full advantage of the weather and had some super social trips out. We have visited the seaside at Weymouth and Swanage and had 2 pleasure boat cruises around Poole Harbour and Brownsea Island. Our days out are always popular and again we rely on our fantastic team of volunteers who give their time to enable such outings. If you think you might like to know more about being a volunteer, whether it is a minibus driver, escort on the bus, companion or a driver to medical appointments, please do get in contact to have a chat. Many of the volunteers say they get as much pleasure from doing this as do the clients!

I thought I would give you some idea in this newsletter as to what we do with regard to community services.

We have in the region of 50 volunteers. Their duties are varied, but most are car drivers, picking up patients from their home and taking them to medical appointments. Some volunteers offer a few hours a week/month for which we are so grateful, whereas others offer many hours each week. This really is up to each individual.

We currently have in the region of 1500 clients on our books, in need of our support, again the majority are for our transport scheme. I thought I would share with you some statistics regarding transport to medical appointments between 1 Jan – 31 July 2018 inclusive. In this period we did some staggering 900+ journeys. In return for our help we ask clients to give a voluntary donation, at their discretion, to support the ongoing service. It is vital that we continue to provide this transport scheme, with so many people unable to get to their appointments at hospitals, and to alleviate some of the worry for them.

For anyone using or requesting to use our services they must ascertain a referral through their GP who have criteria to adhere to.
