

Dr Ian Wilson, MBE FRCGP



President of The Friends of Blandford Hospital, Dr Ian Wilson passed away aged 92 on 20th September last year. He spent his final days in the Palliative Care Unit at Blandford Hospital, at the opening of which he had been a guest just 3 weeks previously.

Dr Wilson, the son of Dr Kenneth Wilson and Nephew to Dr Alan Reid Wilson, who were both GPs in Blandford, followed in their footsteps into the medical profession.

After qualifying as a Doctor at Edinburgh he worked first as a Casualty Officer at Salisbury Infirmary, and then served for 4 years as a Doctor with the Royal Navy, prior to joining his Father in practice in Blandford.

Dr Wilson's service to the medical profession included periods as Chairman of the General Medical Services Committee, Chairman of the Dorset Local Medical Committee, Chairman of the Wessex Educational Committee, Chairman of the Community Hospital's Association and of course his work with the Friends of Blandford Hospital. In 1980 he was awarded the MBE for services to his profession.

In 2007, the centenary year of Blandford Cottage Hospital, he published "From Cottage to Community – The First 100 years or so of Blandford Hospital" having pieced together a huge amount of "bits and pieces" found in his Fathers desk after he died. He was able to continue the story with the opening of the new Hospital on the site of the old Dorset Regiment and Yeomanry Drill Hall and could no doubt have added further chapters on the many changes and developments at the hospital since publication.

Dr Wilson was married for 61 years to Maureen until her death in 2011 and together they had 4 children.

In addition to his services to the medical profession, Dr Wilson was a keen sportsman and he was respected throughout the community having been past President

of the town's Cricket and Rugby Clubs, Rotary, and the Drama Society. The strength of feeling for him throughout the area, and further afield,was recognized in the numbers that came to the packed Blandford Parish Church for the Service of Thanksgiving for his life.



The Friends of Blandford Hospital will sincerely miss Dr Ian and will remember him not just for the work he has done for the charity, but as a true friend. The staff, members, volunteers and trustees extend their condolences to Dr Wilson's family at this time.

Having been a general practitioner in Blandford he showed tremendous commitment and passion for the Friends of Blandford Hospital. He was such a driving force for best patient care and for ensuring the right facilities were in place for Blandford Hospital, and was responsible for planning the upgrade of Blandford Hospital in the 1980s. He also enjoyed researching and writing a book on 100 years of Blandford Hospital, where the proceeds were given to the Friends. His book is still available from our Charity Shops and Office. He will always be remembered for the great care he gave his patients in Blandford and the surrounding locality. It was an honour to work alongside such a committed gentleman. We will now elect a new President and will announce this at the AGM in July 2018.

Project Manager's Update

Sadly, since my last update in the Autumn Newsletter there has been no progress on neither the "Alteration and refurbishment of the Theatre" nor the "Repair to the Hydrotherapy Pool".

We will start soon to push the Trust for progress on the Theatre now that the results of last year's Clinical Services Review are known and also the Hydrotherapy Pool.

Courtyard access for the patients in Tarrant Ward and the Palliative Care Suites:

The work has now been completed which included moving a pair of doors further along the corridor to give disabled pedestrian access into the first-floor courtyard. The new opening in the external wall has been formed, the new door and frame installed, and now – we await the spring and summer for the courtyard to be put to patient use.

Tarrant Ward:

The long-awaited installation of the computer- generated table top activity known as a Torvertafel is now progressing.

We were very impressed with the demonstration given to us last year and in agreement with Gill Wood, Ward Sister, we decided to purchase two. One to be installed in the Day Room and the other to be in the corridor adjacent to the nurse's station so that it could be used during the night for patients who are having trouble sleeping.

The first Torvertafel has been ordered for the Day Room but the position in the corridor by the nurse station is proving a little more complicated due to the construction of the ceiling. We continue to work with the Estates Department to find a solution.

Matron's Update...

We have recruited a new registered nurse (RN) in the

DSU / OPD team following a member of staff leaving to undertake further study. Sue Grant our Band 6 Sister retired at the end of December after almost 30 years of dedicated service. Vicki Cadec who previously worked in the MIU and the OPD / DSU team has been appointed to take over the Sisters post. We are advertising for a new RN to replace Vicki's previous role. Kate Pope our Band 7 Senior Sister is unfortunately for us retiring at the end of May after 21 years' service. Kate is an excellent nurse who has in the past done a great job as acting Matron and will be greatly missed by both the DSU / OPD and the wider Hospital team. We are currently advertising the Senior Sisters post.

MIU has continued to see an increase of attendances this year. We are working with our local GP practices to support improved access to GP services, and we are in the process of recruiting a Band 7 Advanced Practitioner (this could be a RN or registered allied health professional) to compliment the team. This will enable us to provide an appointment service for some patients who would have traditionally been seen in their GP surgery. We are also recruiting another MIU RN as one of our nurses is joining the community nurses in April.

We have been receiving lots of positive feedback regarding the 2 new palliative care suites on Tarrant ward. The Friends kindly funded the finishing touches for the relative's room. Tarrant ward flooring has been replaced and the Friends have funded a door to the patio to be moved to enable better access for Ward patients to enjoy fresh air in the warmer months.

We currently have 3 RN vacancies on Tarrant Ward. Recruitment of RN's is a challenge nationally as I'm sure you will have seen in the press. Fortunately we still have some of the lowest vacancy rates out of all the community hospitals in Dorset. We have had a new RN join the team in January and another new RN starts in April.

The flooring on the stairs, first floor corridor and Physio Department has now all been replaced and the ground floor toilets have also been refurbished. This all looks very smart and will assist our great domestic team to keep the hospital clean.

The Blandford MDT Virtual Ward continues to take place weekly and appears to be working well. During the virtual ward round the multidisciplinary team discuss vulnerable patients in the Community to promote their

health and safety and attempt to prevent admission to hospital.

The outcome of the Dorset Clinical Services Review (CSR) has been published and Blandford Hospital will thankfully be what is known as a Hub with beds, so we retain the beds on Tarrant ward.

Car parking remains a big challenge at the hospital. We have commenced a pilot where we have requested that staff (unless working late / night shifts), do not park in the car park. It is hoped that this will leave more parking spaces on site for our patients and visitors.

The Care Quality Commission (CQC) performed an inspection on our Trust in November. Three inspectors attended our Hospital, their feedback to me was positive on the day of inspection; however we await their written report. The report won't be specific to our Hospital but for all Community Hospitals within the Trust.

Finally, I have been the Blandford Hospital Matron for 8 years (which has flown by) however now it's time for a change and a new challenge for me. I will be leaving the Matrons post at the end of March. I have enjoyed my time here and I am extremely proud of the great care and services the team here provide. I have been lucky to have had the support of great Heads of Departments too.

I am very grateful to the Friends and the community for the tremendous support given to me and to the Hospital in the past, especially when many services were under threat of being withdrawn a number of years ago. This has been overwhelming at times and I cannot thank you all enough.

Prior to starting here in Blandford I had no experience of Friends of Hospitals and I have to say I'm still amazed at the great work done by your charity and the many volunteers. This includes funding of (but not exhaustive) equipment, providing TV's for every bed on Tarrant ward, much building improvement work, supporting staff development, patient activities, providing publications for patients and staff, maintaining the garden, trips in the community and transport to medical appointments. You are amazing please keep up the good work!

My post is currently being advertised and there has been lots of interest. I am involved in the selection process and will do my best to leave your Hospital in good hands.
