We were once again overwhelmed by the support of local people for the Annual Autumn Fair held on Saturday 20th October in the Corn Exchange, Blandford. Over 100 people joined the

queue formed in anticipation of the doors opening and throughout the morning there were so many people not just snapping up the bargains always found at the Hospital Fair,

but there to support the charity and help raise money for projects at the Hospital and throughout the Community.

In 2017, the Fair broke all financial records and yet



again in 2018, thanks to the generosity of local people, a new record was set. Gross takings amounted to more than



£10,600 and with all expenses taken in to account, the event made a profit of more than £9300. The Trustees of the charity would like to thank our members, and all of the local people who turned out on

the day, for their support. Most importantly we thank the

huge team of volunteers that worked so hard to make the event a success. That team is already making plans for the next Autumn Fair on 19th October 2019! We look forward to seeing you there!

Happy New Year to everyone and thank you for all the support you have given the Friends throughout the year. As you will know from the last newsletter, plans are being developed for the new musculoskeletal service which replaces the hydrotherapy pool. This involves the redesigning of

our physiotherapy outpatients department,

creating extra treatment rooms. We are very excited about these plans and you can read more in our Project Manager's report.

I must mention the 2018 Autumn Fair which broke all records since the fairs began. A huge thank you to all the volunteers who worked so hard to make it the success it was, to all of you who came along on the day and of course Emma who organises these events.

I would like to offer my gratitude to Mike and Eve Wood who, after jointly giving over 30 years voluntary service to the Friends, are leaving Dorset for pastures new. As you will see from the article on the front page their input and involvement has been invaluable. They will both be missed very much and they promise to pop in to see us and keep in touch when they are in the area.

At the March Board meeting, Yvonne Thorne of Sturminster Newton was appointed as Chairperson of our Fundraising Group.

Some of you may be aware that I was appointed as a League of Friends Partner Governor to the Dorset HealthCare NHS Trust. This enables me to have direct access to the Trust Board as the role involves a monthly meeting to discuss current and future issues around the health service. This gives us an insight to future developments involving local hospitals and community services. I am able to give feedback to the Trust on any issues that are raised.

Our new website is now live and can be found under www.friendsofblandford.org.uk. Please do take some time to look at all of the information on the site. There is so much to see about the charity, our events, activities, membership and news. To get to us quickly, type the full website address in to the URL, rather than searching for it. Unfortunately, until we are able to disable our old website (which has been delayed for reasons outside our control), using a search Engine for Blandford Friends may bring up the old website.

We are also hoping that the website can be a useful tool for you to help us spread the word about the charity and encourage others to become members, not only for the Friends of Blandford, but also membership of the NHS Trust. The site will be regularly updated and our newsletters will be uploaded so you can read them online and share easily amongst your contacts. At the last Friends Council meeting it was decided to review and update the Friend's Constitution, (which had been in force since the very early days under the West Dorset Health Authority and the North Dorset PCT) in order to reflect the changes in today's local NHS Trust. The Council also decided that the £1 contribution should be increased to a minimum of £5 per annum from 1st March 2019. We hope this increase in membership fees will not deter you from continuing your support to the Friends. We value your membership greatly and all the work that is done in the hospital and the community.

Let's hope that 2019 is a good year for our hospital and our members. I thank you all for your ongoing support.

Since my last report there has been some positive movement on the MSK [Musculoskeletal] Clinic.

Since my meeting last August with Samantha Leonard, The Head of Specialist Services for the Trust, when I was informed the Trust wish to make Blandford Hospital a local centre for MSK I have had

several meetings resulting in Architects being appointed to survey the area of the old hydrotherapy pool and draw up a proposal for three new treatment rooms. However, this design did not produce the floor areas required and resulted in MSK patients having to pass through the Physiotherapy Department.

So, it was back to the drawing board and rethinking the project. As a result, the area under consideration within the Physiotherapy Department was increased to include the gymnasium and a second proposal was created. The architect's new scheme was to relocate the gym to the area originally occupied by the old hydrotherapy pool and the three MSK treatment rooms to be constructed within the old gymnasium. This proposal met with everyone's approval.

A cost plan has now been completed by the Quantity Surveyors along with preliminary specification for air handling, ventilation and air conditioning.

The target for this stage was to have a project up to preliminary layout design and costed ready for it to be considered for inclusion in this year's Capital Programme. The directors were to meet early this year and as we go to print for this spring edition I am still waiting for the result of the January meeting.

I still await a decision on our wish to refurbish The Blandford Hospital Theatre. The trust is aware of our desire to also move forward with this project as they are reminded every time we meet.

It has now been confirmed to me that theatre project is also included in the very long list of proposals from all the community hospitals within the Trust being considered by the directors for the 2019 Capital Programme. So, keep your fingers crossed for the result that we all want.

We have also been able to support smaller projects within our hospital. Our mission is to improve our patient's and visitor's experience when attending for a short stay, visiting a patient, attending our Outpatients, MIU or Physiotherapy, and therefore we consider requests from across the hospital departments.

The first recent request was from Hotel Services which also provides all the food for the patients in Tarrant Ward and for staff and hospital visitors who frequent the Dining Room. They asked financial support in providing new tables, chairs, a two-seater settee, three low back armchairs and a coffee table for the Dining Room.

This was a request that we considered to be a very worthwhile project as it was an area of the hospital used by so many.

The result is a great improvement visually, the colour scheme is refreshing, the chairs far more comfortable and the new tables allow wheel chairs to be moved right up to the table as the wheel chair arms can move under the table top. Pop in to the dining room next time you are passing and you can see the difference yourself.



The other request was received from Tarrant Ward, explaining that although they had a "Tilt and Space recliner armchair", they could use one more to assist in the "day to day" movement of patients within the Ward.

The Management Board agreed with this request also, and the hospital purchase was made.

I look forward to updating you again in our Autumn Newsletter.

I am now well and truly settled in my role as Matron at Blandford Community Hospital. All the teams that work or are based here are amazing and it is great to work with them to achieve the high quality patient care which is evident when I walk around the hospital. We are all very proud of our services.

Tarrant Ward has been re-accredited and awarded the Gold Standards Framework (GSF) Community Hospitals Hallmark Award for sustaining the high quality of supportive care provided for people nearing the end of life. This is a huge achievement; Blandford was the first community hospital to be re-accredited so well done to all the team involved in achieving this award. Thanks to the Friends our patients have access to a Tovertafel, this system has been designed for people in their late stages of dementia. The Tovertafel is an amazing piece of equipment of real benefit to the patients and we are so lucky to have it. I have been known to have a play when passing by!

Currently with the "Friends" support we are looking at redesigning our Out-patient Physiotherapy department and creating additional treatment rooms, plans are being drafted and hopefully work will commence in the near future.

You may have read in the press that Dorset Health Care has been awarded £15.2 million towards the continued reorganisation of the county's NHS. A significant amount will go towards developing a GP and Community Services Hub at Blandford. This is great news for Blandford and we will be working closely with our GP colleagues on what the model will look like for Blandford in the future.

Also, the NHS Long term plan has been released. The main headlines from this are:

- Making sure everyone gets the best start in life (this includes maternity and children services)
- Delivering world-class care for major health problems, prevention of heart attacks, strokes and dementia cases.
- Supporting people to age well, this is where Blandford Hospital fits in as this is increasing funding for community care
- Developing rapid community response teams
- Giving people more say about the care they receive and where they receive it, particularly towards the end of their lives.

There are some exciting times ahead for the NHS and Community Services are definitely a big part of this. This is good news for the future of Blandford Community Hospital, I will keep you posted on developments throughout 2019.

Damory Vets add extra Magic to Tarrant Ward...

The patients on Tarrant Ward have recently been enjoying the benefits of a music box system that has been purchased to use in Conjunction with the Tovertafel system installed last year funded by the Friends of Blandford Hospital.

This additional piece has been funded by the generous support of the Damory Veterinary clinic in Blandford in response to a request from regular ward volunteer Eileen Walters. It adds music to the projector system and the speakers, sensors and projector all work together and interactively with the patients.

The Tovertafel box is a high quality projector with infrared sensors and speakers and processors that work together to project games onto a table. There are two of these boxes on Tarrant Ward. The colourful objects respond to hand and arm movements and the interactive games break through apathy by stimulating both physical and cognitive activity and encouraging social interaction. The system stimulates people with Dementia, it can sooth those that are distressed through the distraction of games and can be used with larger groups of patients to stimulate social interaction.

The music box addition, funded by Damory Vets, enhances the box further and Patients on the Ward find music of benefit immensely as song evokes beautiful memories and it brings about fantastic social interaction.

To quote a recent patient on the ward... "It's Magical!"

Many isolated villages have poor public transport links and we know only too well how difficult this can make it.
