Matron's Update...

Oh my goodness what can I say, except Covid 19!

As expected all of the staff at the hospital have been amazing and shown brilliant teamwork. Most of our services have stopped suddenly apart from Tarrant ward so staff from our theatre and out-patient services have moved to working on the ward along with our cleaners and have also been carrying out portering duties.

When Covid first struck us, the guidelines for wearing personal protective equipment (PPE) kept changing which was a big challenge but fortunately we did always have enough PPE for all staff. Big thanks go out to all in the community who dropped off or designed PPE for us to use at the hospital, we were very grateful. We also had fantastic donations from local companies - there are too many to name them all but among them we received hand creams from LUSH, Easter eggs from Morrison's and cans of Rio to drink from Hall and Woodhouse!

Thank you too to all those who came out and clapped for the NHS on Thursday nights, it meant a lot. One week the police and fire services came to the hospital and clapped with their blue lights flashing. We found these shows of support very moving and they made us all emotional as we are so proud to be working for the NHS.

Our inpatients and their families were amazing, at the height of shut down they were very understanding as to why loved ones could not visit or be visited, although special exceptions were allowed to be made for our end of life patients. I would like to pass on my sincere thanks to all that this affected for your support and

understanding. We are now allowing visiting on Tarrant ward but only one visitor at a time. This needs to be booked via the ward and visitors must wear the provided PPE. We are now restarting some out-patient appointments. Please follow the instructions on your letter if you have an appointment here and follow the guidelines to wear a face mask before entering the hospital. Enter the hospital just prior to your appointment - please do not arrive early. If you arrive early can we request you wait in your car, thank you.

Unfortunately, at the time of writing our MIU is temporarily closed and staff have been moved to Wimborne MIU, with opening hours extended there. Presently there is no update on when MIU at Blandford will reopen. But when a decision is made, we will inform the public. The redesign of the Out-Patient Physiotherapy and Muscular-skeletal department is now complete and looks amazing thanks to the support of the Blandford Friends, alongside NHS funding. This will improve the experience for our patients.

Currently I am providing Matron cover at The Yeatman Hospital, Sherborne until further notice. I am working with their lovely Friends Group as well. What an amazing amount of work the Friends do. We are very lucky to have them and their support at both hospitals. It has certainly been a strange spring/summer and Covid is something none of us have ever experienced. But we have taken on the challenge and we are coming out the other side to a new "normal". Take care all and hopefully see you at the hospital soon.

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


A message from our Chairman...

LIFE DURING LOCKDOWN

I wanted to write this report without mentioning Covid19 but as the Coronavirus has had so much impact on the Friends and all of us it will probably be very hard to avoid it. The doom and gloom we have all read and listened to everyday on the news has not helped our emotional and mental well-being, so I thought I would like to share the positives of the lockdown and discuss how it affected me and my family and the Friends.

Firstly, at home, we were forced to do online shopping and got to know our delivery man, having many conversations over the gate. We soon realised that as we only bought what we actually 'needed' we saved more than half of what we would normally spend! We also took the opportunity to use all our stock in the freezer, giving us more space for our garden produce. The weather, of course, was fantastic with wall to wall sunshine. It gave us the opportunity to concentrate on all those jobs we never had time for before. We religiously took our new pup Ollie - a Cocker spaniel (pictured here), for his daily walk and found several



new walks that we had never found before. When reading the world news, it sounded like the Earth breathed a sigh of relief when everything shut down. It was a time we never thought possible, but of course the negatives were horrendous with so many affected by the virus and so many deaths and so much sadness.

We got used to talking through Zoom, Microsoft

Teams and online communications which kept us in touch with our family and we even had a Friends Board meeting through the Zoom platform, which brings me on to how the Friends coped with the lockdown.

Although, our shops had to close, our transport came to a halt, and befriending ceased, the people behind the scenes kept working from home catching up on all those jobs and keeping in touch with our volunteers. Of course, we had to postpone our usual annual July AGM, rearranging it for September. But unfortunately since then, we have made the decision (following both government advice whilst keeping in line with the charity commission ruling) and cancelled our AGM for this year.

Emma has been extremely busy preparing the shops for the new 'normal' to make them Covid safe. Our Blandford shop opened in July and Sturminster in August, but on reduced hours initially due to a limited number of volunteers. Emma is looking for volunteers to help in both shops, so if you have any spare time – even a couple of hours a week – then please do get in touch with her.

As you are aware the transport service is temporarily closed following government guidelines with regards to social distancing. However, at present, the majority of routine hospital and doctor appointments are conducted by telephone or video link.

The Minor Injuries Unit at Blandford Hospital has been temporarily closed and the staff have been redeployed to Wimborne and Shaftesbury to boost their staffing numbers. The Friends are currently lobbying the Trust for a date when it will be returned to Blandford.

So how will things change? My view is that this new 'normal' is going to be with us for a while. We are all going to have to adapt to the new way of life and I do hope we maintain the wonderful comradeship and appreciation of the NHS which was so apparent during the lockdown. I wish you all well and stay safe.

Project Manager's Report...

Unfortunately, the coronavirus epidemic took its toll on the MSK / GYM project in the Physiotherapy Department, leaving the contractor struggling to obtain many items for the construction which were manufactured in factories off site. And as a result, the original completion of March was not achieved.

But I can now report that the removal of the old hydrotherapy pool followed by internal alterations created a particularly useful location and new room for the new physiotherapy gymnasium. The old gym area was then converted into three MSK Clinics and on Friday the 24th July I attended a "handover meeting" for the completed project.

Since my last report, the Management Board also received a request for financial support for providing the couches and ancillary furniture for each of the new clinics which we agreed to support and can now be seen in the photograph here.

Finally, I will continue to pursue the refurbishment of our theatre / treatment suite area once everything returns to some sort of normality for the hospital and the Trust after the "lock down".

I was born in Guernsey, Channel Isles in October 1945. I joined the Royal Navy as an electrical engineer and left as a Petty Officer after 12 years service. I then worked with a company in Poole as a Ministry of Defence contractor, dealing with Radio Frequency



interference testing and consultancy. This was followed by a moving to a company in Essex in 1983 as Technical Director. After 2 years I was made redundant and so formed EMC Projects – where we were based in Ringwood and subsequently moved back to Blandford. The company was a UK military and EU commercial testing and consultancy company. Testing all types of electrical / electronic equipment and carrying out installations, including ships, aircraft and army vehicles. Associated companies in Hong Kong and Japan were set up and we became a major EU test facility for commercial products, toys and factory installations. We also designed and installed MRI rooms which require a very high level of interference protection. I was also an active member of an EU specification committee attending regulars meetings in Brussels. The company was sold and I left in 2007 and became an independent consultant involved in the design and testing of a crane facility in Devonport for removing nuclear rods from submarines. I joined the Friends as a volunteer driver taking patients to appointments. Then also took on being a driver for the Friends mini bus, for shopping and social trips. I in turn became a Trustee and was chairman of the Fund raising committee. Where I assisted in both of the charity shops. I moved from Blandford to Southbourne in March 2018 but continue as a Trustee, for what is a fabulous and well worthwhile cause for the community. I will continue to keep my link with the Friends, as long as I am able and still enjoy both supporting the Friends events and visiting the many friends and acquaintances that I have made over the years.


