Our Community Services have also restarted with our hospital medical appointment car service, again in big demand along with our mini-bus shopping trips becoming

Our Zoom Council and Management Board Meetings have now been replaced with "face to face" meetings but sadly not our usual hospital committee room due to Trust restrictions on public access to our hospital. As a result, we have had to find an alternative venue and we are now using The Parish Rooms in The Tabernacle, opposite the Post Office in Blandford. Sadly, we have to say goodbye and a big thank you to Helen Hunt, our Matron, who is leaving us as the end of August to take up a new post within the Trust. Throughout the Covid period we have continued our health-related community support, and these still continue. This year we have provided continued financial support for the student Councillor at The Blandford School and towards the "day to day" running costs of The Blandford Opportunities Group. Both community groups have been supported by us for many years as we consider their health activities in the community are commendable. Finally, sadly our membership numbers continue to fall, currently standing at 723 as recorded in our Report and Accounts for 2022. Could I close by making a request to every member to try and encourage a friend or acquaintance to become a member. As you all know, we are a wonderful local charity with the one objective to support our hospital, patients, and health related community groups.

Plans for the future

We are continuing to arrange fund raising events for the coming year and are looking at our old fund raising which had been very successful, however it is still proving quite difficult under the current conditions. Hopefully, as the year progresses, we will be able to announce the events as they are finalised.

The trustees present their report along with the financial statement of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2022. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and reporting by Charities 2011. The Friends are a registered charity (No. 800482) and whose business is conducted and managed by its Officers and Trustees (as listed above). This charity is governed by the rules of The Friends of Blandford Community Hospital Constitution, Objects and Rules, dated March 1994 (amended 2008 & 2019). The trustees all give freely of their time and expertise without any form of remuneration or other benefit in cash or kind.

Objectives and Activities

The objects of the Friends shall be to provide support and assistance to patients of the hospital and preserve and protect the health of the community by providing and assisting in the provision of facilities, support services and equipment not normally provided by the NHS or statutory authorities and a gardener to look after the Millennium Garden and the Portman Unit Courtyard. In pursuance of these objects the Council continued to raise funds and to invite and receive contributions from individuals and organisations by way of subscriptions, donations or otherwise. Efforts are made to enlist the support of a broadly based substantial membership in order to keep in touch with the actual needs of the population, and existing members are encouraged to assist in this respect. The Friends continued to supplement the service provided by the hospital management for the health, welfare and comfort of patients and also provided amenities and support in the hospital and the community for patients, staff and others, including the Blandford Opportunities Group, who provide a day facility for disabled children. In considering applications for financial support the following priorities are adopted:

- a) Major projects that add to the well-being and/or treatment of patients and/or the working conditions of the staff.
- b) Additional equipment that would extend or enhance work carried out by consultants in the hospital.
- c) Additional equipment to facilitate treatment given in the wards and outpatient clinics.
- d) Grants for further training of hospital staff, especially nursing staff.
- e) Improvements to the hospital environment.
- f) Equipment for improved care in the community and health related community projects. It is expected that Dorset HealthCare University NHS Foundation Trust will fund the provision and replacement of standard hospital equipment, fixtures and fittings.

Financial Review

In the year ended 31 March 2022 income decreased by £1,105,778 over the previous year, resulting mainly from a decrease in legacy income of £1,147,978. This was offset by increased income from trading activities which rose by £46K to £144K, bringing it back in line with the 2020 figure of £145K. Membership figures have been revised to show the actual income received from membership, i.e., membership fee of £5 multiplied by the number of members, any surplus receipts being included under Donation. The decrease of £7k for the year is the result of this change in reporting and does not reflect a decline in the number of members.
